Fueled by the promise of riches, the discovery of gold on the Klondike River started a frenzied rush that brought more than 30,000 hopeful miners to this forlorn territory. Brutal conditions and starvation cost many lives in the guest.

Mountain historian John W. Robinson will tell the gripping story with a slide presentation on the way it was in 1898 and the way it is today. Robinson, a life-long veteran of "walking the trails" has hiked the treacherous Chilkoot Pass twice and has explored the Klondike region bringing the story to life.


